BE IT ENACTED by the President and Members of Parliament in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:-			
1. The Constitution of Sierra Leone 1978 (Act No. 12 of 1978) is hereby amended by the substitution for subsection (6) of section 23 thereof of the following new subsection-	Section 23(6) of Constitution replaced.		
 "(6) A person elected to the office of President under this section shall assume that office on the day upon which he is declared elected, or upon the date his predecessor ceases to hold office as President by that office becoming vacant in any manner described in section 28 of this Constitution, whichever is the later." 2. The said section 23 of the Constitution is hereby further amended by the substitution for the proviso to subsection (7) thereof of the following new proviso- 	Section 23(7) of Constitution amended.		
"Provided that- (i) where any proceedings have been lawfully com- menced or taken for the purposes of the election

3. (1) For section 28 of the said Constitution there is hereby substituted the following new sectionSection 28 of Constitution replace, etc.

- (b) where the incumbent dies or resigns or retires from the office, or
- (c) where the incumbent ceases to hold that office in pursuance of section 30 or 31 of this Constitution:

Provided that the President shall not resign or retire from this office even at the due expiration of his term of office while a general election of Members of Parliament is pending within the ensuing six months, or where a state of public emergency has been declared.

(2) Any resignation or retirement by a person from the office of President shall be in writing addressed to the Chief Justice and copy thereof shall be sent to the Speaker."

(2) For the word "resigns" appearing in subsection (4) of section 21 and in subsection (1) of section 25 of the Constitution there is hereby substituted the words "resigns or retires".

4. Section 38 of the Constitution is hereby repealed.

5. The said Constitution is hereby further amended by the substitution for subsections(4) and (5) of section 39 thereof of the following new subsections-

> "(4) Where for the purposes of an election more than one candidate is nominated but at the close of nomination on the nomination day preceding the election, only one candidate stands nominated, a further period of seven days shall be allowed for the determination of nomination; and it shall not be lawful for any such person so nominated to withdraw his nomination within the said period of seven days.

(5) Where-

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- (a) after the expiration of the period of forty-eight hours referred to in subsection (4) of this section, there is not pending nomination appeal and only one candidate stands nominated, or
- (b) at the end of the determination of nomination appeals under subsection (4) of this section, only one candidate stands nominated.

then there shall be no election and that candidate shall be be declared elected."
